Reminders

PLEASE REMEMBER TO CANCEL YOUR FLIGHT IN SCHEDULE MASTER IF YOU CAN'T FLY. THE BOARD CAN CHARGE ONE HOUR PER DAY AT THE SCHEDULED AIRCRAFT RATE ACCORDING TO CLUB POLICY #15.

The EPA is cracking down on pilots dumping "sumped" fuel on the ramp. It is a very steep fine if you are caught. We have purchased devices to filter the fuel back into the aircraft. It is a little cumbersome the first time you use it, but it is necessary. Remove the top (strainer) section of the fuel tester, drain fuel, and place fuel strainer on top of tester. Open top of strainer and carefully replace fuel back into fuel tank.

From the Membership Director

Everyone in the Pattern is "Out to Kill You"

Words that one of my instructors (Phil Verghese, who by the way is an excellent instructor) once told me. At first you laugh and it is kind of funny, but you don't forget it and that is what is important. If taken seriously those words could save your life.

Recently I was told of a real close call here at Nampa. A Cessna was on final and a Cherokee cut right in on a short base to final never seeing the Cessna. A plane holding short told the Cessna to break right and go around. Had the Cessna not done that there could have been an accident.

Pilots enter the pattern in many different ways. Some of the common methods are: entering on the crosswind, crossing mid field and turning directly downwind, entering directly on the downwind, entering the downwind on a 45 and some just come straight in. I tell my students to look for other aircraft entering the pattern from these different directions as they fly the pattern. Don't expect other pilots to enter the pattern the same way you do. If they see another aircraft in the pattern I tell them don't expect the aircraft to do what you expect it to do, once again not every pilot fly's the pattern the way you do.

It is always a good idea to check with FSS before every flight. There could be new TFR's posted in the area you are about to fly, or numerous other items you wouldn't otherwise be aware of.

Please be very careful to ONLY wash the windscreens in an up-and-down motion. Also, along with your normal post-flight, make sure the keys and fuel card are in the bag and left in the box at the hangar.
