## FUEL RE-IMBURSEMENT PRICE FOR OCTOBER: \$4.51/qal.

### Aircraft Maintenance

Monitor 121.5 after landing, and before shutdown, to be sure the ELT in your aircraft hasn't been activated.

Aircraft doors and locks are VERY SENSITIVE. Insert keys and gently turn. Slamming doors and forcing keys to operate seriously harms latches and security devices.

Oil usage is going up. Read "Aircraft Oil Usage" on the T-Craft Website for more information.

Clean up your aircraft: this includes washing windshields and windows, vacuuming carpeting on floors and panels, and removing all personal items (including cargo bay).

ALWAYS FLY THE AIRPLANE

I recently went and heard Sparky Imeson speak on mountain flying and his experiences. One of those SCHEDULE MASTER IF YOU CAN'T FLY. THE BOARD CAN CHARGE ONE HOUR PER DAY AT THE SCHEDULED AIRCRAFT RATE ACCORDING TO T-CRAFT CLUB POLICY #15.

The EPA is cracking down on pilots dumping "sumped" fuel on the ramp. It is a very steep fine if you are caught. We have purchased devices to filter the fuel back into the aircraft. It is a little cumbersome the first time you use it, but it is necessary. Remove the top (strainer) section of the fuel tester, drain fuel, and place fuel strainer on top of tester. Open top of strainer and carefully replace fuel back into fuel tank.

experiences was his crash. He is an excellent speaker with a wealth of knowledge and I really enjoyed his

presentation. I walked away feeling inspired and privileged to have

heard him speak. I would like to share a couple of lasting impressions I left with.

The first was never get complacent with your flying. When we fly to the same destination a number of

times it can be real easy to let down our guard. You have done this same approach so many times you can do it in your sleep. This is when accidents happen, like with Sparky. As pilots we are PIC or pilot in command, the key word is command. When flying that approach, fly like it is your first time at that airport, even Nampa. If you are flying with another pilot, be aware of your surroundings and if you think you are getting into a situation you shouldn't be in speak up. Your instructor used to call this "situational awareness". Just because the plane has auto pilot doesn't mean the pilot should be in auto pilot as well.

The other thing was practice. I have mentioned this before but when

we go out and fly we need to keep up on our skills. Make a list of maneuvers you would like to get better at and instead of punching holes in the sky go out and practice. Take along a fellow pilot and

practice with him. We can all help each other with our flying.
