375: Nothing to report.

686: Thirty-five hours past TBO.

64L: Nothing to report.

<u>91X</u>: Transponder received; scheduling time for installation.

OYD: Alternator belt tension pulley and hardware repaired.

93S: Rosen Visor ordered. Windshield ordered. No. 2 radio re-installed at Aero Services using a tool larger than Jim Eyre's.

NOTICE! Your aircraft must be properly signed out, including the correct designation; for example, local, cross country, maintenance,

### Reminders

Park your vehicles away from the T-Craft hangar, especially if it does not fit between the concrete drain and the building.

Our membership has been doing a SPLENDID job of keeping the hangar and office clean and organized.

**Delete** the remainder of any unused flight time from Schedule Master immediately after landing. Somebody may be able to use that time.

Catch your sumped fuel. Not only is it a safety hazard to you and your aircraft, but the EPA can

replacement aircraft search, etc. If an aircraft moves, breathes, or sneezes, it MUST be correctly documented for maintenance and billing.

**Got a squawk?** Write the <u>tachometer</u> time on the Squawk Sheet. Use the Hobbs time for all other recordings.

Aircraft components and locks are very sensitive. Slamming doors and forcing keys to operate seriously harms latches and security devices.

November's ground class will be entitled "Ask An Instructor". This

will be a chance for you to ask a question on any topic related to

your flying. If your landings haven't been the best lately or maybe

it has been a while since you have flown into Boise's airspace, this

will give you a chance to discuss this with an instructor. I feel

this should make for a very educational ground class. Even if you

don't have a specific question, someone else might bring up a topic

that you find helpful to your flying. Like the saying goes, "A good pilot is always learning."

There will also be a drawing for one free hour of instruction with me. Not only will your questions be answered but you might win the chance to go up and work on it with me.

slap a heavy fine on anyone caught tossing fuel out. Sump the fuel into a **CLEAN** catch can, then pour the fuel back into the tank through the strainer/filter (located in your aircraft). WARNING! DO THIS AWAY FROM SPARKS, OPEN FLAME, and ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES.

Keep the bellies on our ladies clean. Read "Aircraft Oil Usage" on the T-Craft Website for more information.

Okay, you landed and the wheels are still on the axles and struts. Make sure you monitor 121.5 before shutdown - to be sure the ELT in your aircraft hasn't been activated.

**Look cool** wearing your T-Craft emblazoned cap and shirt that you bought from **Bulldog Shirt** Shop. Located on 12th Avenue Road South, Nampa, Idaho, they have our logo and will put it on any item in their catalog.

Post Post Flight Check List: a) Clean all glass -inside and out, including suction cup smudges on interior windows. b) Clean and pick up trash in cockpit and cargo bay. c) Vacuum carpet. d) Clean all leading edges, including wing and main gear spring struts, flaps leading edges, cowl chin, rear empennage leading edges, propeller, spinner, and wheel pants. e) Remove the Aircraft Checklist from your kneepad and return to the aircraft.

T-Craft Members are responsible for keeping their contact information (phone numbers, email addresses, postal address) updated in Schedule Master. To check or update your contact information, login to Schedule Master, click the "User" tab at the top, then click the link that says "Click here to edit your user info" which appears just above the list of users. AVEMCO will remove your name from their insured list for failing to keep your License and Medical Certificate current, and you WILL be suspended in Schedule Master.

If this class goes well we might continue it every so often. These ground classes are conducted so members can continue their aviation education. I have always learned something at every ground class.

Hope to see you there. The class is Thursday, November 20th, at 7 pm in the T-Craft hanger.
