Winter Flying Blues

With the weather we have had so far this winter many of us have not had a chance to go flying and may not get that chance until spring. I know as pilots this makes for a long winter. Here is a thought on how to turn those blues into something positive. Take this time and brush up on some of the knowledge we learned in training and use as pilots. One suggestion is to take an online knowledge test. There are places vou can take it for free. See how you do. You might find some areas that could use a little review. Maybe you could do this with a fellow pilot and review the material together. Working with someone else is always a great way to learn. Another suggestion is start studying for a new rating. If you are thinking about getting your instrument rating there is plenty of work you can do long before you start flying. I actually took my written not long after I started the flying portion of my training.

Even if you are not planning on getting an instrument rating you can always read about instrument flying. You never know when you might need these skills and if you are one of the first five members to call me at ph: 761-1219; I will give you one half hour of flight training.

and DO NOT STRAIN FUEL IN HANGAR! Aircraft components and locks are very sensitive. Slamming doors and forcing keys to operate seriously harms latches and security devices.	You could do a little hood work in the spring with an instructor, and there are also videos and DVDs you can watch to help improve your skills. We have some in our library at the hanger. If you watch YouTube.com you'll find there are many videos on flying.
Catch your sumped fuel. Not only is it a safety hazard to you and your aircraft, but the EPA can slap a heavy fine on anyone caught tossing fuel out. Sump the fuel into a CLEAN catch can, then pour the fuel back into the tank through the strainer/filter (located in your aircraft). WARNING! DO THIS AWAY FROM SPARKS, OPEN FLAME, and ELECTRICAL APPLIANCES.	Just because we have to sit on the ground doesn't mean we can't continue to grow as pilots. Fly safe. Jeff Beers
