A chance encounter at a small country airport in northern San Diego County reignited my life-long dream of flying. I started instruction there, then transferred to the Private Pilot course at Palomar College. Being a typical starving student, I paid for lessons by making jewelry while living in a tent in the hills behind the campus. After graduation, I earned my Commercial license on the GI-Bill at Van Nuys airport in the San Fernando valley.

My wife's generosity with her inheritance enabled me to obtain my Instrument, Multi-engine, CFI and CFII ratings. I had a 2-year gig as a corporate pilot, then returned to school for airframe and avionics training. My avionics job moved to northern California where I also instructed for a local flight club.

A year later, we became part owners of an FBO. As the manager, I established a flight school offering all levels of flight instruction—primary, advanced, instrument, BFR, IPC, and aircraft checkout. After qualifying for an FAA Part 135 Air Taxi certificate, I flew single and multi-engine charter across the west. I also flew Air-Attack for the US Forest Service in the Sierra Nevada Mountains.

A surprising—but higher—call led us to join Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF). They assigned us to Ecuador, South America. For 17 years, I flew C-185s and C-206s in the Amazon Jungle and Andes Mountains where the only transportation options were to walk for days or fly for minutes. Normal operations took me to places you wouldn't drive your car on—if you could get it there.



MAF's move to KMAN brought us to the Treasure Valley in 2006. In 2015 I joined the T-Craft Aero Club where I now serve as club secretary. Today, I write aviation articles, blogs, and books. What I love most about flight instruction is seeing "the lights come on" when someone acquires a new skill or hones their experience to an even sharper edge.

As of this writing I have about 7,200 hours total of which 1,300 hours are as instruction given.
